Week 1

Make Believe

Pretend to be a penguin like Emma.

Use the penguin from your pack to waddle on the beach or swim in the water.







Talk to your child about penguins. Your child will also enjoy seeing real penguins at your local zoo or aquarium.



Magic Camera Game 2



Before the Activity

- Gather the required Memory Chips from your pack.









 Cut out the Parent Sheet and Child Sheet.





Show for 3 seconds

How to Do the Activity



Show your child the picture grid on the **Parent Sheet** for 3 seconds (*do not show any longer*).



Hand your child the Child Sheet and the required Memory Chips.



Have your child try to replicate the same picture grid.



After your child has placed their chips, show your child the original picture grid and make any corrections together in a positive way.

Say things like, "This chip is the same, well done!" or "This chip was very close, let's move it over here. Now it's the same."



Praise your child's effort.







It is very important to praise your child's effort and give them a lot of encouragement when doing this activity. Children may take time to master this activity.

Show your child the picture grid for 3 seconds, have them replicate the picture grid by placing the Memory Chips onto the Child Sheet.




Magic Camera Game 2

Whole and Half




Which apple is half? Use your **Pencil** to circle it.

Flip






At home, cut some fruit in half like Emma did in the video to help teach your child the concept of half.

Please be sure to ask your child "Which is A?" or "Where is A?" rather than "What letter is this?"




Which One?
