Magic Camera Game

baby














Magic Camera Game

Please keep this page. It will be used again in Week 3.






Blue Card

Hold the Blue Card about 30cm from your child's face and have them stare at the orange kangaroo for 15 seconds.



Put the card down and have your child close their eyes. With their eyes closed say: "You can see an orange kangaroo. You can see an orange kangaroo clearly. How is the kangaroo feeling? Is the kangaroo laughing, or crying? Let's count backwards from three and open our eyes. Three, two, one, open your eyes."

Once your child has opened their eyes, ask them if they saw the kangaroo, and how the kangaroo was feeling. You can also have them draw what they imagined.





If it's hard for your child to close their eyes, help your child to cover their eyes with their hands. Please also make sure to ask "Did you see the orange kangaroo?" not "What colour kangaroo did you see?"

Top, Middle, Bottom

Kuri




Alphabet


Repeat with the rest of the puzzles in the book, making sure to change the pieces as needed.


Number Writing
